CHAPTER V

CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION

In this chapter explains about the conclusions and suggestions related to this final report.

5.1 Conclusion

In the analyzing students' argumentative essay using Toulmin Model the writer found that there are six elements in the argumentative essay of English Department students of Sriwijaya Polytechnic. Elements of Toulmin Model stated that Claim, Ground, Warrant, Backing, Modal Qualifiers, and Rebuttals. From the results of data analysis, each element is taken from the essays of students who have been proven to have these elements in their essays. It was found that most English Department students of Sriwijaya Polytechnic use claim (30) and ground (30) in argumentative essays. The other four explicit arguments were below claim and ground. They were warrant (11), backing (3), qualifier (2), rebuttal (2).

5.2 Suggestion

After analyzing the students' argumentative essays, proportional to the writer's arguments and the multiple arguments from each point, the writer suggests to the readers, especially the argumentative essay writers or candidates, use the Toulmin argumentation model. This kind of model can help the student writers in developing their argument. In addition, in making arguments, this model can help the researcher analyze which points make sense and which do not. Furthermore, this model can be used by academics such as lecturers and judges. It can assist them in developing, and grading arguments in argumentative essays, public speaking, and so on.
