

## CHAPTER V

### CONCLUSIONS AND SUGGESTIONS

This chapter discusses the conclusions and suggestions on the process of writing the storybook.

#### 5.1 Conclusions

The focus on this final report is about writing the storybook “Kemas and the Magic Maksuba Village” for children. The method that is used in writing the storybook is research and development (R&D) method including: preliminary study and model development. Preliminary study consists of three steps, they are literature study, field study, and model draft. Literature study is done by reading several books, journals, and articles to find info on the elements in children’s storybook, the steps to write children’s storybook, and the steps to write children’s story plot. Next, field study is done by doing documentation as a technique of analyzing the data. The documents are collected in form of storybooks through the internet. The storybooks are used to review about the cover, the content, and the language used. After analyzing the data from literature study and field study, the writer was made the model draft by using the steps to write the storybook which consisting of five steps including: developing story idea (theme), collecting storytelling material, determining the title of the story, determining the characters of the story, making a storyboard

After making the model draft, the stage used is model development. Model development consists of two steps including: limited testing and wider testing. In limited testing, the model draft is reviewed by two language experts (English & Indonesian) and one expert in illustration. In terms of languages (English & Indonesian), the experts comment mostly about grammatical errors. Meanwhile, in terms of illustrations, the expert comments on the illustration page 14 of the storybook. After that, in wider testing the revised model draft reviewed by two

language experts (English & Indonesian) and one expert in illustration. In terms of languages (English & Indonesian), there is no any correction about grammar. Meanwhile, in terms of illustrations, the expert suggests to add the writer's profile on the back page of the storybook in order to give the information about the writer. The revised product in wider testing is considered as the final product of this study. The storybook consisted of 35 pages including the front cover, the back cover, and the writer's profile with a size of 21 cm x 21 cm.

## **5.2 Suggestions**

This study is incomplete because, the writer did not do the third stage of research and development (R&D) method. Therefore, the writer suggests the next researchers conduct the final product testing. Furthermore, the writer suggests the next researchers to make another storybook that introduces Indonesian culture in the form of traditional food. In is essential in efforts to inform and preserve culture.
