CHAPTER I

INTRODUCTION

1.1 Background

Tourism is traveling activity to refresh mind and get pleasure. In tourism activities, there are a lot of things to do starting from visiting tourism objects or enjoying the tourism attraction available. It is in line with Kodhyat (1983, p.4) who states that tourism is traveling from one place to another temporarily which is done individually or in group, in order to find a balance and happiness with the social environment, culture, nature and science.

In Indonesia, every province has tourism objects to introduce their own culture, especially Palembang city. The Balaputra Dewa museum has many collections to attract visitors, the collections are divided into some categories. The categories are historic, ethnography, ceramic, carved object, biologicals, and Limas house. Besides attraction, public facilities are also needed to make visitors comfortable while visiting museum.

A public facility is a part of elements of tourism. According to Faiza (2014) public facilities are facilities or infrastructures provided by the government used for mutual interests in daily activity.

In Balaputra Dewa museum, visitors can use some public facilities such as canteens, toilets, mushola, and so on. But, some of the public facilities in Balaputra Dewa museum are not appropriate. Some of the public facilities in Balaputra Dewa museum are in bad condition. For example, in the toilet of Balaputra Dewa museum there is no sign for the toilet, and then there is plastic bag in the tub. So, it is not in line with the Ministerial Regulation of Tourism and Creative Economy Republic of Indonesia No. 17 on 2014 which states that toilet for visitors should be clean, well maintained and separated for male and female visitors whereas in each of the toilet equipped with clear signs, clean water, hand washers and dryers, dustbin and urinal for male visitors.

Based on the explanation above, the writer would like to write the final report entitled "The Visitors' Perception on Public Facilities Provided in Balaputra Dewa Museum".

1.2 Research Formulation and Limitation

1.2.1 Research Formulation

As one of historical object destination in Palembang, Balaputra Dewa museum saves a lot of collection.
